## How To Use The New Selection Sheet

### A practical guide for subscribers

The Daily Punter Club system is built to give subscribers a structured way of reading a race card. It is not about guessing, chasing, or blindly backing favourites. It is about narrowing each race down, identifying the strongest runners, finding value, and building sensible bets around the information.

Nothing in horse racing is guaranteed. The aim of the system is to help subscribers make better betting decisions over time by using structure, discipline, and value.

## 1. What Makes This System Different

The Daily Punter Club is not random tips and it is not simply AI-generated selections. The sheet is built from real racing information, including form, speed, track suitability, distance, going, jockey/trainer factors, market value, and system points.

The goal is to reduce guesswork, narrow each race down, and give subscribers a clear structure they can use for straight bets, value bets, and exotics.

## 2. Main Sections On The New Sheet

Section	What It Means	How To Use It
Speed Rating	The horse that rates strongly from a speed and performance angle.	Use as a warning horse, exotic inclusion, or possible danger to the final selection.
Natural Horse	The horse that naturally stands out from the race setup and racing profile.	Use to compare against the final selection and to identify strong contenders.
Final Selection	The main ranked system view for the race.	Use as your starting point for win bets, exotics and race structure.
Suggested Plays	The final betting instructions for the card.	Use this as the quick working guide for the day.
Race-by-Race Guidelines	Floating banker, exotic horses and value/outside watchlist for each race.	Use this to build your own bets or follow the structure provided.

## 3. Understanding The Three Main Selection Columns

### Speed Rating

The Speed Rating is the horse the system identifies as one of the strongest from a speed and performance angle. This does not mean the horse will automatically win. It means the horse has shown enough speed-related strength to be respected.

- Use it as a warning horse.
- Use it as an exotic inclusion.
- Compare it against the Natural Horse and Final Selection.
- Respect it in Swingers, Exactas, Trifectas and Quartets.

### Natural Horse

The Natural Horse is the runner that naturally stands out from a racing point of view. It can be based on form, race setup, suitability, jockey/trainer support, draw, class, going, distance, or overall profile.

### Final Selection

The Final Selection is the system's main ranked view for the race. It brings the different factors together and gives us the horses we want to focus on most. This should be your main starting point when reading each race.

## 4. Race-by-Race Guidelines

The race-by-race section is one of the most important parts of the new sheet. It gives a quick working view of each race and tells you how to approach that specific race.

Column	Meaning	Best Use
Floating Banker	The horse we believe has the strongest chance in that race from the system view.	Use as the main win view, first exotic horse, or banker if the race allows.
Exotic Horses	The runners suggested for Bi-Pot, PA, Pick 6, Swingers, Exactas, Trifectas and Quartets.	Use these to build structured bets and cover the dangerous runners.
Value / Outsider Watchlist	Bigger-priced horses with enough system support.	Use for small win/place, wider exotics and value plays.

Important rule: the Value / Outsider Watchlist must come from the Top Final 5 horses only. We do not want random roughies. We want value horses that the system still respects.

## 5. Best Bet

The Best Bet is the strongest betting view on the card. This is the horse where the system gives the most confidence overall.

- Straight win bet.
- Daily Double / Win Double leg.
- Possible Pick 6 banker if it falls inside the Pick 6.
- Possible PA banker if it falls inside the PA.
- Key exotic horse.

A Best Bet is still not guaranteed. It is simply the strongest system-supported runner on the card.

## 6. Next Best

The Next Best is the second strongest horse on the card. It can be used as a second win bet, a double leg with the Best Bet, a strong PA or Pick 6 inclusion, or a possible banker if the race looks suitable.

## 7. Value Bet

The Value Bet is not always the horse most likely to win. It is the horse that offers the best balance between system support, price, winning chance, place chance and potential return.

- Use as an each-way bet.
- Use as small win with a stronger place bet.
- Use as a Place Double leg.
- Use as a Place Treble leg.
- Use in exotics.

## 8. Outsider Bet

The Outsider Bet is a bigger-priced horse identified by the system. It is not normally the safest horse on the card, but it has enough system support to be worth including.

- Small win bet.
- Good place bet.
- Swinger horse.
- Exacta / Trifecta / Quartet inclusion.
- Wider exotic cover.

Do not over-stake the Outsider Bet. It is there for value and payout potential.

## 9. Daily Double / Win Double

The Daily Double or Win Double is normally built around the two strongest win horses on the card. Short-priced horses can be used in a Win Double because the goal is to get both horses to win.

Example structure: Best Bet x Next Best, or Best Bet x Strongest Banker.

## 10. Place Double

The Place Double should not be built with very short favourites. For our system, the Place Double must be value-based.

Rule: no horse shorter than around 4/1 should be used in the Place Double.

- Horse should be 4/1 or bigger.
- Horse must be inside the Top Final 5.
- Horse must have system support.
- Horse must have a realistic place chance.
- Horse must offer value.

## 11. Place Treble

The Place Treble follows the same rule as the Place Double. It must be built from value horses, not short-priced favourites.

Rule: no horse shorter than around 4/1 should be used in the Place Treble.

- Use three value-based horses.
- All three must be inside the Top Final 5 of their races.
- All three must be strong enough to run into the places.
- Do not use random outsiders.

## 12. Bi-Pot

The Bi-Pot normally runs over six races. On the working sheets, we clearly state which races the Bi-Pot covers. The aim is to control cost while still protecting the dangerous legs.

### Bi-Pot approach

- Banker where the system gives us a strong standout.
- Use fewer horses in easier legs.
- Go wider in open races.
- Do not use more horses than needed.
- Keep the cost under control.

Do not automatically use five horses in every leg. If there is a strong banker, banker it. If two horses stand out, use two. If the race is open, go wider, but normally no more than five.

## 13. Place Accumulator

The Place Accumulator, or PA, is one of the best bets for structured racing because the horse only needs to place. It is useful when we have strong place horses, one or two banker legs, and a few value horses that can run into the places.

### PA approach

- Banker the strongest place horse if suitable.
- Keep strong races narrow.
- Go wider in open legs.
- Use value horses where they can place.

Do not automatically use four horses in every PA leg. If one horse is strong enough, banker it. If two or three are enough, use two or three. Only use four when the race needs proper cover.

## 14. Pick 6

The Pick 6 is where we try to find the winners across six races. It is higher risk, but it can produce strong payouts when structured properly.

### Pick 6 approach

- Find one strong banker if possible.
- Use a second banker only if the system strongly agrees.
- Go wide in the open races.
- Spend the money where the race is dangerous.
- Do not waste money covering races where one horse clearly stands out.

The Pick 6 must be built with discipline. Do not go wide in every race just because you can. The goal is to know where to stand strong and where to spend.

## 15. Suggested Plays Section

The Suggested Plays section turns the analysis into practical betting options. This is the quick guide on the sheet and can include Best Bet, Daily Double, Value Bets, Outsider Bet, Place Double, Place Treble, Bi-Pot, PA and Pick 6.

## 16. Final Strategy Note

The Final Strategy Note explains how we want to attack the full card. It tells you which horse we are taking a strong stand with, which race is the banker race, which race is the value race, which race needs wider cover, which outsider must be respected, and where the exotics can pay.

This is one of the most important parts of the sheet. It tells you how to think about the full card, not just one horse.

## 17. How Subscribers Should Use The Sheet

You do not have to follow blindly. You can follow the sheet exactly, use it as your main betting guide, add your own fancies, reduce the number of horses to lower cost, go wider if your budget allows, or use the Best Bet, Value Bet and Outsider separately.

The most important thing is to stay disciplined. Do not chase losses. Do not over-stake outsiders. Do not change the structure emotionally after one bad result. Do not bet every race the same way.

## 18. Simple Betting Approach

Player Type	Use	Avoid
Conservative Player	Best Bet, Next Best, PA, small Place Double.	Large Pick 6, big outsider win bets, overloaded exotics.
Balanced Player	Best Bet, Value Bet each-way, PA, Pick 6 with one banker, small Place Treble.	Chasing losses or forcing every bet.
Aggressive Player	Best Bet, Value Bet, Outsider Bet, Pick 6, Exactas, Trifectas, Quartets and wider exotic perms.	Playing aggressively without the bankroll for it.

## 19. Final Message To Subscribers

The Daily Punter Club system is designed to help you bet with structure. We are not trying to pick every winner blindly. We are trying to narrow the race down, identify the strongest horses, find value, build smarter exotics, manage risk, and stay profitable over time.

The sheet gives you the structure. The final betting decision is always yours.
